"Marital status" is defined in section 10 of the Code as "the status of being married, single, widowed, divorced or separated and includes the status of living with a person in a conjugal relationship outside marriage", including both same-sex and opposite sex relationships.

Pre-Employment Inquiries and Marital Status or Number of Children Questions about marital status and number and ages of children are frequently used to discriminate against women and may violate Title VII if used to deny or limit employment opportunities. It is clearly discriminatory to ask such questions only of women and not men (or vice-versa).

Marital and parental status discrimination, also called familial status discrimination, is discrimination in the workplace based on whether an employee is married or single, or whether they have children or not.

Marital status is one of the basic issues involved in a lawsuit for divorce (marital dissolution) or an annulment (nullity). At the end of a marital dissolution or nullity proceeding, the legal status of husband and wife is terminated and the spouses are returned to the legal status of being unmarried or single persons.

Marital Status. Questions on marital status were asked of respondents in each survey year except for the 1968 mail survey. In general, the resulting 'Marital Status' variable includes six coding categories: married--spouse present, married--spouse absent, widowed, divorced, separated, and never married.

Marital Status & Marital Transitions

The US Internal Revenue Service (IRS) interprets the married status as a married couple living together either by ceremony or common law, or living apart but not divorced or legally separated. The IRS still considers a couple married if they have a decree of divorce that is not final at the end of the tax year.

De facto marital status can be defined as the status of each individual in terms of his or her living arrangements within the family or household, regardless of that person's legal marital status. Persons who have the family status of 'partner' may also be seen as having the de facto marital status of 'living with a spouse or partner'.
